




#### **ABOUT RIYADH ART**

# TUWAIQ'S INTERNATIONAL SCULPTURE SYMPOSIUM 2021

Tuwaiq's International Sculpture Symposium brings artists from different nationalities to create their art and showcase it, with an aim to expand the understanding and appreciation of international art, educate and effect social change in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, as well as to create a platform for intercultural dialogue. Artists will sculpt in a live setting from **November 10 until December 1**. This will be followed by an exhibition of the final pieces from **December 2 to December 6, 2021**.

In 2019, Saudi Arabia opened its doors to international art through the cultural activities of the first International Tuwaiq Sculpture Symposium, which was inaugurated at the Tuwaiq Palace in the Diplomatic Quarter. Featuring, 23 sculptors, including 20 from abroad and three Saudi artists.

The Second TISS was launched in 2020. It was organized by the Ministry of Culture. The Symposium witnessed 20 sculptors, including 18 from abroad and two Saudi artists. The artists implemented the sculptures in the Diplomatic Quarters, inspired by the famous Jabal Tuwaiq. The symposium was attended by students, experts and the ambassadors of the artists' countries.

## REQUIREMENTS

Applications are open to **stone sculptors of all nationalities** with at **least 5 years of experience** exhibiting works permanently or temporarily in outdoor spaces or galleries. An expert panel comprised of five renowned members and curator **Ali Jabbar** will review each application, and a final list of 20 artists will be commissioned to create new works at TISS.

Following the artist open call, applicants should submit all supporting material to <a href="mailto:tiss.invitation@gmail.com">tiss.invitation@gmail.com</a> with the subject line: "[Full Name] - Tuwaiq International Sculpture Symposium 2021"

#### Applications should include:

- 1) Applicant portrait
- 2) Five (5) photos of previous sculpture works
- 3) 3D digital renders of the white stone project proposal
- 4) 3D digital renders of the black stone project proposal
- 5) A signed copy of the Artist Open Call Invitation

#### **HONORARIUM & PRIZES**

After the completion of the Symposium, the Expert Panel and Curator Ali Jabbar will select the best sculptures based on an Artwork Selection Criteria and award the final prizes as follows:

**1st Prize**: 75,000.00 (SAR) **2nd Prize**: 37,500.00 (SAR) **3rd Prize**: 18,750.00 (SAR)

Additionally, an honorarium of 37,500 (SAR) will be paid to every participating artist.

Note: Travel and accommodation expenses for the artist and one assistant shall be covered by the TISS service provider.
